November has been designated as Native American Heritage Month, and the time to celebrate the culture, accomplishments, and contributions of people who were the first inhabitants of the United States, and on whose land we live today.

This November, and every month, we celebrate the culture and heritage of these remarkable Americans who deeply enrich the quality and character of our Nation.

Joy Harjo is a multidisciplinary artist and a member of the Muscogee Creek Nation in Oklahoma. Her passion for the arts began early, and by the age of sixteen, she attended the Institute of American Indian Arts (IAIA) in Santa Fe, New Mexico, where she discovered painting as one means of expression on her way to becoming a professional poet, playwright, author, and musician.

Joy Harjo's work draws on Native indigenous histories and storytelling, as well as feminist, environmental, social justice, and poetic themes. The complexity, relevance, and beauty of Harjo's poetry have made her both a household name and a critically acclaimed poet.

She is the first Native American U.S. Poet Laureate, and only the second Poet Laureate Consultant in Poetry to serve three terms. For her signature project as the 2019-2021 U.S. Poet Laureate, Harjo gathered the works of contemporary Native American poets into a fully digital map titled [Living Nations, Living](#)



Instead of selecting national honorees, the NWHA encourages groups throughout the country to use the theme to recognize and honor women in their own communities, organizations, or agencies.




